Mt Buffalo's angel is one of seven that were placed simultaneously around the world - everywhere from Canada, Peru and the South Pacific to the Ural Mountains in Russia. An international initiative of the Unite Hope Project and Swedish sculptor, Lehna Edwall, the project was supported by Mt Buffalo Resort and Parks Victoria which suggested an appropriate site.

As you'll see when you stroll around the garden, the little angel's location isn't obvious; tucked away in the garden bed by two seats on the rocks closest to the pool. "We chose this location because it was in keeping with the atmosphere of the gardens and overlooking the mountains, which made it ideal for contemplating something as important as world peace," says Head Ranger at Mt Buffalo National Park, Felicity Brooke.

The angel's Swedish custodians, Madeleine and Steffan Thor, stayed in the Chalet overnight preceding the installation ceremony and were treated to the best Mt Buffalo Resort hospitality.
